L. Carleton highlighted the impact COVID19 is having on Municipalities. Also, that the lack of connectivity and high-speed internet in parts of the Parry Sound District is an issue for conducting virtual meetings. Spring Flooding is a concern.

T. Kelly highlighted that Municipalities are reducing staff in offices, but still being responsive to taxpayers. Also, he shared a concern that some citizens still don't seem to understand the seriousness of the current social distancing guidelines

P. Schoppmann advised that many communities events have been cancelled or are on hold, until the COVID pandemic is over

A. MacNevin has been busy speaking with many partners regarding the COVID 19 related issues. The lag in testing results is a concern like others shared. A plan has been created for an increase in cases on the Island. A plan to keep summer residents home is underway, due to the negative impact it have to all citizens

District of Algoma

Connection was lost with L. Watson

City of Timmins

G. Pirie advised that there are 21 cases in the Cochrane district including two young boys. That the delay of five days in testing is causing an issue. That the homeless population is a concern as Social Distancing is not being respected. The Revenue hole is a concern and the future impact to the homeowner and the business community. Also, he highlighted that the Banks and Insurance companies have been silent to date on how they will assist businesses, Post Secondary institutions, communities and the Province. The City is still providing services safely to it citizens.
